CLIMATE CHANGE POLICY

1. Introduction

The Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) Bagh is leading efforts to combat climate change by implementing sustainable practices, reducing carbon usage, and promoting climate education, all to ensure a healthy and conducive learning environment. In Pakistan, climate change presents a significant challenge to social, environmental, and economic development. The country's most urgent priority is to prepare for and adapt to its impacts.

2. Scope

Higher education institutions globally are actively working to address climate change by minimizing their carbon footprint, educating future leaders, and providing critical research and expertise. Advancing environmental sustainability plays a key role in achieving sustainable development goals (SDGs) and promoting overall health.

3. Policy Guidelines

The main objectives of Climate Change Policy include:

- a) To advance the university's transition towards cleaner and less carbon-intensive growth.
- b) To minimize the risks arising from the potential increase in frequency and intensity of extreme weather events.
- c) To develop climate-resilient agriculture and food systems for all agroecological zones in the region.
- d) To integrate climate change policy with other interrelated organizations.
- e) To reduce energy consumption, we need an eco-friendly environment that conserves natural resources such as water, energy, and raw materials and focuses on producing organic food.
- f) To focus on tree planting as it is considered one of the most effective tools for combating climate change and restoring biodiversity.
- g) To track the impact of climate change on the water, food, and energy security of the country and to implement remedial plans to support water, energy, and food policies

h) To pursue sustained economic growth by appropriately addressing the challenges of climate change.

4. Strategy

Natural disasters are challenging to handle and can cause considerable damage. The Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) has outlined several short-term measures to address climate change impacts. Long-term strategies will be aligned with the National Policy of the Azad Jammu & Kashmir Government. The strategies of WUAJ&K are as follows:

- a) **Sustainable Environment:** The university is committed to promoting sustainable practices and minimizing environmental impact.
- b) Waste Management: Efforts are underway to educate students and faculty on waste management and disposal through seminars and fieldwork, such as cleanliness campaigns.
- c) Reduction in Greenhouse Gas Emissions: The university aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from its activities and operations by encouraging energy-saving practices across the campus.
- d) Water Conservation: WUAJ&K implements water-saving techniques and educational programs, including seminars and rainwater harvesting techniques, to promote water conservation and reduce water usage.
