



Programmes for services access

The Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir is committed to ensuring equitable access to basic services for all its students and the broader community. The university has implemented various programs to enhance accessibility to educational resources, healthcare, counseling, and financial support. These initiatives include scholarships for underprivileged students, health services, and mental health counseling to support student well-being. Additionally, the university collaborates with local NGOs and government agencies to extend these services to the wider community, particularly in underserved regions.

1. Free Healthcare Services

The Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) offers students and the local community free healthcare services. A medical center within the Allied Health Sciences campus is staffed by a qualified doctor who provides essential health services, including routine check-ups, treatment, and medical advice. In addition, many training sessions and workshops are arranged to raise community awareness about health issues. This initiative ensures that students and community members can access quality healthcare without financial constraints. (Evidence in Annex. I)

2. A Range of Seminars and Workshops on Health, Nutrition, and Food Security

The WUAJ&K has been actively organizing training sessions and workshops focused on health, nutrition, and food security, with a commitment to ensuring equitable access to basic services for all its students and the broader community. 



SCHOLARSHIP POLICY

1. Introduction

The Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) Bagh is committed to providing quality education to students, even those who cannot afford it. Therefore, the WUAJ&K designed a scholarship policy to financially support those students. In addition, a relaxation in fees is provided to Refugee students. The policy aims to support deserving students and provide a holistic educational experience by acknowledging merit, need, and talent.

2. Scope

This policy applies to all applicants, irrespective of political, religious, or cultural affiliations, caste, color, creed, and gender, who can benefit from this policy.

3. Policy Guidelines/ Implementation Procedure

3.1: Scholarships

There are several scholarships that students apply for at the time of admission, and they will be awarded based on eligibility criteria.



Report on Food Quality

(From January to June 2023)

The Directorate of Student Affairs at Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) Bagh is committed to ensuring students' access to nutritious and hygienically prepared food in Cafeterias and Hostels. This report outlines the supervision and monitoring activities undertaken during the first half of 2023 to ensure the highest food quality and hygiene standards within the university's hostels and cafeterias.

1. Objective

The main objectives of these efforts were to ensure that the food served meets nutritional standards, that high hygiene standards are maintained during food preparation, storage, and serving, and that the university complies with local and national food safety regulations. Importantly, any student complaints regarding food quality and hygiene were promptly addressed and resolved, demonstrating our commitment to student satisfaction.

2. Actions

Over the past six months, the university has been proactive in conducting unannounced visits to all university cafeterias, including those at the main campus, College of Education campus, Benazir Palace campus, and the new construction site at Bani Pasari. These inspections, which focused on food preparation, storage, and serving practices, are a testament to our dedication to ensuring the highest food safety standards. The freshness of ingredients, cleanliness of kitchen and serving areas, and the proper storage of food items, particularly perishables, were all meticulously checked. Special attention was given to ensuring refrigerator temperatures in cafeterias, girls' hostels, and faculty hostels complied with food safety standards.

Periodic meetings were held with cafeteria management to discuss student feedback and to strategize on continuous improvements. This commitment to ongoing enhancement ensures that we always strive to provide the best possible service. Regular training was provided to all cafeteria staff on food safety and hygiene practices, covering essential topics such as hand washing techniques, gloves and hairnets, and the importance of maintaining clean works paces.

Staff compliance with these practices was monitored during inspections, and feedback was provided to reinforce good practices where necessary. We also recognize the vital role of our students in ensuring food quality and hygiene. Active hostel students were designated to oversee the hostel mess and dining area during food serving hours, providing valuable feedback to the Directorate and actively contributing to our efforts.

3. Observations

a) Overall Hygiene

The cafeterias and hostel kitchens generally maintained a good standard of cleanliness in both kitchen and serving areas. Students taking meals to their rooms were creating unnecessary messes and disrupting discipline. Consequently, hostel cooks were advised to enforce a two-hour dining period and not allow students to take meals to their rooms.

b) Food Quality

The quality of the food served was consistently high. Fresh ingredients were used in meal preparation, good-quality oil was utilized, and no extra food was cooked. The menu was prepared by students under the hostel warden's supervision.

c) Staff Compliance

Most staff adhered well to hygiene practices. Ongoing training and reinforcement of procedures have been effective in maintaining these standards. Kitchens were cleaned daily.

d) Student Feedback

Students' feedback was largely positive, though some requested more diverse meal options and quicker response times to specific dietary requests.

4. Future Actions

A feedback system will be implemented in the Directorate of Student Affairs office, allowing students to report any concerns regarding food quality or hygiene anonymously. This feedback will be reviewed regularly, and immediate action will be taken if any issues are reported. Further collaboration with the university's medical officer will be pursued to discuss potential improvements and to utilize her expertise in assessing compliance with food safety regulations.

5. Conclusion

Supervising and monitoring food quality and hygiene in university cafeterias and kitchens requires constant vigilance and proactive management. So far, the steps have ensured that students receive safe, nutritious, and enjoyable meals. The Directorate remains committed to upholding these standards and continuously improving practices.
