Training program funded by British council at FJWU

At the national level, we are committed to promoting cross-sectoral dialogue and driving impactful change aligned with the SDGs. Dr. Tahira and Ms. Tehzeeb Mahreen participated in the training program organized by Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU) Rawalpindi in August 2023, focused on Bridging the Gender Gap (SDG 5): Creating Women Leaders through Mentoring and Coaching in Pakistan funded by the British Council. Seminar on cyber security in collaboration with the government

We recently organized a seminar (May 17, 2023) on cybersecurity and the use of social media in collaboration with the Planning and Development Department of the Government of AJ&K and UNDP. It highlighted its importance in advancing several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including Quality Education (Goal 4) and Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions (Goal 16). By enhancing awareness and skills in cybersecurity, we empower individuals and communities, fostering resilience and innovation (Goal 9). Our discussions emphasized the need for collaboration (Goal 17) to create a safer digital environment, ultimately supporting sustainable development and protecting our shared future.
