



Collaboration with NGOs for SDGs

Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) actively encourages students to volunteer and places them on various underprivileged occasions to uplift, support, guide, and facilitate society from different angles. This includes student volunteer support for teaching orphans and other needy students in society in collaboration with local NGOs. The Allied Health Sciences students volunteer with different organizations to arrange free medical camps, medical services, and counseling for household women and needy groups of individuals in society. Environmental sciences students also actively volunteer for ecological protection/ green programs in the field and awareness seminars.

Facilitation to Medical Camp Organized by Al-Jaza Welfare

WUAJ&K supports medical camps collaborating with the AL-Jaza Welfare Foundation to enhance the partnership between stakeholders, including local healthcare providers, NGOs, educational institutions, and the community. This actually promotes education regarding the health and well-being of the local public in line with sustainable development goals, specifically SDG 17. (Evidence at Annex. I)

Collaboration with Read Foundation and Aghosh Al Khidmat Bagh

In collaboration with Read Foundation and Aghosh Al Khidmat Bagh, WUAJ&K organizes workshops and seminars for local society. The university also participates in several welfare initiatives by these organizations, i.e., providing free education to orphans and needy students. In this regard, the university directs the students to volunteer in teaching practices in their free time (summer vocations); specifically, the senior students of the Department of Education are sent there for their final year projects, internships, and teaching practices to contribute to sustainable development goals.
