

### **Scholarships**

Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) Bagh is committed to admitting students from the bottom 20 % of household income groups and supporting them through numerous scholarships in different categories. To serve students from low-income families, the university has made a concerted effort to provide various scholarships. As a result, approximately 20% of the students received scholarships, demonstrating a strong commitment to making education accessible to all. Furthermore, The WUAJ&K Bagh is dedicated to supporting disabled students by offering wheelchair facilities for enhanced mobility across the campus. Department assistants are available to help these students move between classrooms, access the library, and reach the university bus stop, ensuring they have complete access to all resources and services. Finally, The WUAJ&K Bagh provides relaxation to students admitted to refugee seats. Each department has one seat for refugees in each session of the undergraduate program. The details of scholarships provided in the year 2023 are provided in the following graph.







### **Programs for Low-Income Students Support**

The University designed several programs to provide the necessary resources and opportunities to help these students overcome financial barriers and succeed academically. For instance, economic support in tragedies with students, job opportunities in research projects, free healthcare services, counseling, and mental health services, discounted and quality food in the hostel/ cafeteria, access to computer/ internet facilities for freelancers (only for female students after working hours), workspace training programs, discounted transport facilities, and free ambulance service (for first aid/ near hospitals). Moreover, in alignment with our commitment to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), we are also extending the waiver to students from low- and lower-middle-income countries, subject to the fulfillment of admission eligibility criteria provided on the university website.

### **Local Start-up Assistance**

To support the local community surrounding the WUAJ&K, where the excellent weather conditions are ideal for gardening, sericulture, and fruit plantation, we are committed to fostering financially and socially sustainable businesses. Recognizing the potential for significant income generation in these areas, we have organized workshops providing relevant education and resources. These workshops include mentorship programs, training sessions, and access to university facilities. Furthermore, (WUAJ&K) Bagh actively contributes to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by providing substantial financial support to the local community. Key initiatives include free seed distribution to the community and financial support for establishing sericulture units. The photographs on the next pages show the several training, seminars, and initiatives taken by WUAJ&K for the assistance of the local community.



### **Programmes for Services Access**

The WUAJK Bagh ensures equitable access to basic services for all its students and the broader community. The university has implemented various programs to enhance accessibility to educational resources, healthcare, counseling, and financial support. These initiatives include a range of seminars and workshops on health, nutrition, food security, and mental health counseling to support student well-being, free healthcare services, support in education in the form of scholarships, discounted hostel charges, discounted and quality food in the hostel and discounted transport facility and free shuttle service. Additionally, the free access to university resources for freelancers and provides clean drinking water to the community. The university collaborates with local NGOs and government agencies to extend these services to the wider community, particularly in underserved regions.




























### **Education Outreach Activities Beyond Campus**

### **Focus on Women Education and Empowerment**

As an institution dedicated exclusively to the education and empowerment of women, the university operates under a clear mandate established by the Act of Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) Bagh (2014). The act is available online: https://nasirlawsite.com/laws/wuajkb.htm

According to Clause 5 of this act:

"University open to all Female Gender. - (1) The University shall be open to women students only and no woman shall be denied the privilege of the University on the grounds of religion, race, class, colour or creed."

This mandate underscores our fundamental commitment to inclusivity and equal opportunity. We systematically track women's application and acceptance rates to ensure compliance with this legislative requirement.

For 2023, we are pleased to report that our university has achieved a 100% rate in both the application and acceptance of women. Every woman student who has applied to our institution (fulfilling essential eligibility criteria for admission in a specific program) has been granted entry, reflecting our unwavering adherence to the principle of equal access protected in the Act of WUAJ&K 2014.

Our comprehensive tracking system accurately records and analyses application data to ensure our admissions process is transparent and equitable. By maintaining this 100% acceptance rate, we fulfill our legal obligation and commitment to fostering a supportive educational environment where all women can pursue their academic and professional aspirations without barriers.

This success highlights our dedication to establishing an inclusive academic community where women from diverse backgrounds can contribute meaningfully. As we continue to uphold these principles, we remain focused on ensuring that our university remains an institute of equal opportunity and empowerment for all women.







#### Women's Access Schemes

At WUAJK, we are dedicated to empowering women through a comprehensive range of access schemes designed to support their academic and professional development. Our initiatives include various scholarships to alleviate financial barriers and promote educational excellence. Additionally, we offer career counseling services to guide women in making informed career choices and achieving their professional goals. We provide training in freelancing and other essential areas to further enhance their skills and employability. Moreover, we offer opportunities for participation in extracurricular activities, such as debate society and various clubs. These activities foster leadership skills, creativity, and teamwork, enriching the educational experience. These schemes are part of our commitment to fostering an inclusive and supportive environment that equips women with the tools they need to succeed.

### Women's application in underrepresented subjects

In 2023, WUAJ&K observed a notable reduction in female admissions, particularly in the natural and some social sciences departments. To address this reduction, we have launched targeted initiatives to inspire and support female students in these underrepresented fields.

Our faculty members are actively involved in outreach efforts to bridge this gap. For instance, the Physics faculty recently conducted outreach events at Read Foundation School and College in Bagh. During these visits, distinguished faculty members, including Dr. Adeel Younis, Mr. Azhar Saeed, Mr. Ayyaz Ahmed, and Mr. M. Wazir, led engaging workshops, demonstrated experiments, and discussed theoretical concepts. These activities provide hands-on experience and emphasize the diverse benefits and career opportunities available in natural and social sciences. Besides this, many faculty members visited several government schools and colleges in the district to raise awareness about higher education, choice of subjects, and career opportunities.

# **Commitment to Carbon-Neutral University**

The Women University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (WUAJ&K) is actively playing a crucial role in its journey toward becoming a carbon-neutral university through various strategic initiatives. The university is focused on teaching and research practices to increase citizens' awareness and several initiatives are taken.

#### **Gas Emission Reduction**

The WUAJ&K initiated a campus shuttle service in 2020 for students and staff, significantly reducing reliance on private cars within the university premises to reduce carbon emissions from private vehicles. Several shuttle buses at different times (8 am to 4 pm) are operated by a university transport office for students, administration, and faculty for the Banni Passari and Sahalian Campus. The reduction of private cars in the University Campuses directly reduces fuel burn from the vehicles. In this way, the university is effectively minimizing carbon emissions associated with transportation, promoting a cleaner and more sustainable campus environment.

#### **Plastic Waste Management**

The university is taking important steps to decrease waste and its environmental impact. These efforts contribute to a more sustainable campus and support the goal of achieving carbon neutrality. The university has worked on Zero Waste Management practices and approved a Plastic waste management policy that fulfills the requirements of many SDGs. Some of the strategies applied to help achieve the goal of Zero Waste as well as plastic management are given below:

**Landfill waste:** The collected plastic waste was packed in cargo bags and delivered to landfill areas for proper disposal. The use of plastic material is reduced in Women's University, where using paper or organic bags is promoted.

**Disposable material:** Reduce the use of paper, disposables, and all non-essentials.







**Public awareness:** Campaigns and seminars at the Women's University increased awareness among students, faculty, and the community regarding threats to the environment and their potential solutions.

#### **Tree Plantation on University Premises**

At WUAJK, locations other than buildings are considered for planting annually during the spring and monsoon seasons. More than 70 percent of our university is covered with trees and other vegetation that plays a significant role in carbon sequestration. Moreover, the university is focused on increasing green cover across its campus. Through tree planting campaigns and the enhancement of green spaces, Women's University is not only improving biodiversity but also enhancing its capacity to sequester carbon.













#### **Use of Hydroelectric Power as a Main Source**

The WUAJ&K main power source is hydropower provided by the AJK Electricity Department. By relying on this renewable energy, we effectively avoid the carbon emissions associated with traditional power generation methods, such as diesel generators, and align with our commitment to low-carbon energy tracking.

#### **Renewable Energy Integration**

**Solar Power:** Given the ample daylight, small-scale solar systems have been installed across the split campuses, providing clean energy for campus operations and reducing reliance on grid power. Additionally, permanent infrastructure is under construction, where installing high-power solar systems is considered to enhance sustainable energy use.

**Solar Water Heating:** The WUAJ&K utilizes solar thermal systems for hot water needs. This aligns with abundant sunlight and reduces the need for electric water heaters.

#### **Maximize Daylight Utilization**

At WUAJ&K, classroom and office designs are optimized to maximize natural daylight. Windows are strategically placed, and interior spaces are oriented to ensure maximum sunlight penetration, contributing to a more sustainable environment.

#### **Excellent Weather Conditions**

**Natural Ventilation:** At WUAJ&K, strategically placed windows and vents optimize airflow, helping maintain comfortable indoor temperatures without air conditioning.

**Shaded Areas:** Shaded zones around buildings enhance cooling by preventing direct sunlight, contributing to the overall heat reduction inside.

**Thermal Mass:** Buildings incorporate materials with high thermal mass that absorb and release heat throughout the day. This helps to stabilize indoor temperatures, reducing the need for additional cooling or heating.







**Forest Location:** The campus is forested and surrounded by many trees. This natural environment plays a key role in controlling and stabilizing temperatures across the campus, reducing the reliance on mechanical cooling systems.

#### **Optimize UPS Use**

**Energy Efficiency of UPS Systems:** Regularly maintain and ensure that UPS systems are energy-efficient. If they are outdated, consider upgrading to more energy-efficient models.

**Smart Power Management:** Implement innovative power management practices to optimize UPS backups. This includes managing load distribution and ensuring that only the UPS powers essential equipment.

#### **Energy Conservation Initiatives**

**Energy Audits:** The WUAJ&K conducts regular energy audits to identify and address inefficiency. The audits focus on insulation, window glazing, and other energy-saving measures.

**Behavioral Practices:** At WUAJ&K, energy-saving behaviors such as unplugging devices and minimizing unnecessary electrical equipment use are actively encouraged across the campus. To further promote these practices, notices are placed in every classroom, reminding students and staff to turn off lights when not in use. Additionally, security staff conduct daily evening inspections to ensure compliance.











### **Local Education Programs on Climate**

The WUAJ&K Bagh is taking various steps to promote climate awareness among the community through educational programs. The university has organized several programs focused on climate change. These programs include mentorship programs, training sessions, and access to university facilities.

#### **Planting and Crafting Workshop**

**Objective:** Foster climate resilience through sustainable planting and eco-friendly crafting. Participants can learn about native plants that support local ecosystems and carbon sequestration.

#### **Activities:**

- Hands-on planting of drought-resistant and native species.
- Crafting items from biodegradable or recycled materials reduces waste and promotes sustainability.

**Impact:** Enhances community knowledge of biodiversity and its role in combating climate change.

# **Water Resource Management Workshop**

**Objective:** Educate the community on sustainable water practices to mitigate climate impacts. Understanding water conservation is crucial as climate change leads to altered rainfall patterns and water scarcity.

#### **Activities:**

- Training on efficient irrigation techniques and rainwater harvesting systems.
- Discussions on the effects of climate change on local water resources.

**Impact:** Empower participants to implement water-saving measures, enhancing resilience to climate-related water challenges.





















#### **Kitchen Gardening Workshop**

**Objective:** Promote local food production and sustainable practices to reduce carbon footprints. Growing food locally decreases reliance on transportation, contributing to greenhouse gas emissions.

#### **Activities:**

- Instruction on organic gardening techniques that preserve soil health and biodiversity.
- Workshops on composting to reduce organic waste and enhance soil fertility.

**Impact:** Participants gain skills to sustain food, fostering self-sufficiency and resilience against climate impacts.

#### **Sericulture Workshop**

**Objective:** Introduce sustainable silk production as a climate-friendly agricultural practice. Through the cultivation of mulberry trees, sericulture can contribute to sustainable livelihoods while promoting biodiversity.

#### **Activities:**

- Education on the lifecycle of silkworms and environmentally friendly rearing practices.
- Workshops on creating silk products that emphasize sustainable sourcing.

**Impact:** Participants learn to engage in sustainable agriculture, creating economic opportunities while mitigating climate effects.

#### **Seminars on Sanitation and Hygiene**

#### **Community Cleanliness Initiatives**

A cleanliness drive involves community engagement to clean public spaces, promote hygiene, and raise awareness about the importance of cleanliness. The WUAJ&K organizes seminars on this topic, highlighting its commitment to supporting government efforts in this area.



#### Partnership with NGOs for the Goals

A few examples of relationships with NGOs are as follows:

#### Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan

Faculty members from WUAJK&K Bagh play a key role in the policy-making process for Aghosh Alkhidmat Bagh, a project by the Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan dedicated to providing humanitarian services to orphans. Dr. Anees Abbasi, a lecturer in the Department of Computer Science and Information Technology and a member of the management committee of Agosh Alkhadmat Bagh, is particularly involved in policy-making and administration.

### **Aljiza Welfare Foundation for Disabled Persons**

ALJIZA Welfare Foundation is a local organization for disabled people. Several faculty members of WUAJK&K Bagh contribute to this organization, which provides humanitarian services to disabled people. Dr. Abdul Muteen, an Assistant Professor of the Department of Economics, and Mr. Asif, an employee of WUAJ&K, regularly participate in the policy-making and administration of this organization.

#### **Mental Health Screening Camp at Aghosh Alkhidmat Trust**

BS Psychology students and teachers from WUAJ&K organized a mental health screening camp (April 7, 2023) at Aghosh Alkhidmat Trust in Bagh. This initiative aimed to provide essential mental health services to the community, offering screenings, assessments, and support to needy individuals.



# **Cross-Sectoral Dialogue about SDGs**

#### Training Program Funded by British Council at FJWU
